The Church in Bremhill near Calne bulged with 400 as the Village Hall(via relay) hosted a further 100 souls to celebrate his joyous life. Another 30-minute tribute to a fabulous person and a further celebration at a local hostelry. Incredibly both funerals were set half an hour apart on the same day a distance of 150 miles apart....and I had to chose which funeral to attend. Both super people, both will be greatly missed. Our condolences to both widows Lia and Kate and to all their families.

It is not often that one receives a card from the King but the Parish Council were thrilled to get a letter from Buckingham Palace that was presented to the Council by the Clerk at our latest meeting. We received the missive after we had written expressing our condolences to King Charles after the death of his mother Queen Elizabeth. The Council decided that we should get it framed and hang in the Village Hall for posterity. Touching.
